President's Report

I am pleased to present my report for the 2008 - 2009 season.

The year since the last AGM has been a particularly sad one. In September the man who taught Dunedin to swim, Duncan Laing, lost his battle with ill health. Duncan was one of one of New Zealand's most celebrated swimming coaches. A kind and humble man, always willing to share his expertise or a story no matter where you were on the totem pole.

Very recently another well known figure around the pool deck, Norm Duxbury, also lost his battle with ill health. A stalwart member of Kiwi Club. He always had time for a chat, even if you didn't, and was never scared to stand up for the little guy.

January and February this year saw the tragic loss of two past Otago Swimmers, Mitchell Walker and Shaun Ross. Both were well accomplished swimmers representing Otago at regional and national level. Two young men in the prime of their lives and bright futures ahead of them.

Moving on to performance in the pool, congratulations to the small but talented group of swimmers who represented New Zealand at numerous International meets. This season we had Bryn Murphy and Shane Patience competing at Oceanea Champs in Christchurch; Katie Kenneally at the Trans Tasman Tri Series in Australia; Shane Patience at the World Youth Champs in Monterrey; Stefannie Gillespie and Phoebe O'Leary at the Pacific School Games in Canberra; Shane Patience and Phoebe Williams at the Junior Pan Pacific Champs in Guam; and Katie Kenneally at the Australian Youth Olympic Festival in Sydney. We also congratulate Andy Adair, Frank Wylie and Kay Alexander on their appointments as Head Coach, Coach and Team Manager at three of these meets.

We continue to be well represented at National Meets. Summarising the numbers, we had 35 at the 2008 NZ Spring Competition, 6 individual medals and 1 relay medal; 14 at the 2008 NZ Summer SC Champs, 4 individual medals and 3 relay medals; 26 at the 2009 NZ Junior Champs, 3 individual medals and 3 relay medals; 34 at the 2009 NZ Age Group Champs, 33 individual medals and 1 relay medals; 36 at the 2009 NZ Division II Competition, 26 individual medals; 14 at the 2009 NZ Open Champs, 5 individual medals and 2 relay medals; 53 at the 2008 South Island Champs, 91 individual medals; and 26 at the 2009 SI Country and Town competition, 30 individual medals and 2 relay medals. Top ten club placings were Neptune; 3rd at NZ Summers, 6th at NAGS, 4th at NZ Open Champs. Waves; 9th at NAGS, 8th at Div II.

The 2009 Otago Champs saw its second outing under the revised format which once again proved to be successful. Entries were marginally up on last year with 219 swimmers (up by 1) and 1725 entries (up by 67) The competition for top club was a close race with Waves 1st with 2645 points, followed by Neptune 2476 points and Queenstown 1112 points.

Club competitions were well supported. However, the annual Otago vs Southland Shield, Danyon Loader Trophy and Country Club meets were not held. It would be a pity to see these traditions fade away as they are the only opportunity our swimmers have to be selected to represent their region.

If records are to be used as a yardstick to gauge our success this year showed an improvement on last year's decline with 84 new records set, an improvement on last year's 67. The highlight of the new records is the breaking by Matt Henderson from Wanaka of the two oldest records in the books - Jeff Conroy's 1970 100m breaststroke and 1971 100m breaststroke in the boys 10 to 11 year age group. Looking at meets between 1st April 2008 and 31st March 2009, it was close but no cigar in the quest for a national record. Shane Patience, Phoebe Williams, Stefannie Gillespie and Katie Kenneally all achieved times that were less than 1% off the National mark. Congratulations to

Shane Patience whose 1500m time 15:38.05 was 0.33% off the 18 years record and wins him the Naylor Cup. However, we acknowledge and congratulate Matthew Glassford for setting and still holding the National male 18 years LC Age Group Record for 200m Breaststroke. As this swim was in April 2009 it falls outside the timeframe for the Naylor cup contest.

On the development front the Academy of Sport South Island has set up the Academy Otago programme to offer high performance support to help develop promising athletes. Athletes on the programme were selected by the Academy of Sport across all codes in Otago. Of the 13 athletes selected, Shane Patience, Katie Kenneally and Phoebe Williams from Swimming make up the largest group. Congratulations to you all.

Membership is up on last year with our role standing at 1651 excluding any movement due to transfers. Related to membership is the long awaited launch by Swimming New Zealand of their National database. Once some initial teething problems are ironed out the database has the potential to be a useful tool for Clubs and the Region.

Despite recording another deficit we remain financially sound. Grateful thanks go to the Lion Foundation for their grant of \$5000. The adoption this year of a policy to set up and manage a fund to support our National representative swimmers concluded a protracted debate on the topic.

Congratulations to Kay Alexander on attaining National IOT and Starter certification. We also welcome Paul Harris , Karen Bolch (Starters) Latham Wardhaugh and Patricia McNaughton (IOTs) as well as a number of new timekeepers to our team of Technical Officials. A big thank you to for stepping forward, as well as to the old hands. Without your dedication the sport would not survive.

This report brings to an end my term as President. My sincere thanks to the outgoing committee for your hard work, support and guidance over the last year. My best wishes to the incoming President and committee. I look forward to another successful year of swimming.

Dunedin Clubs Development Squad (DCDS):

With OSCA introducing a third squad (C Squad), most of the Neptune DCDS swimmers opted to belong to this new squad, Neptune withdrew from the DCDS programme as it was no longer meeting the needs of our swimmers.

We have continued our Monday night squad in the dive/lap pool for our more competitive swimmers under the coaching of Jared Sandri (OSCA second coach). The majority of these swimmers are in the OSCA C squad.

Development swimmers:

Our Monday night swim development programme is going exceedingly well. Jill Clarke's Swim School continues to provide us with excellent poolside instructors and a fantastic development programme that is enabling our young swimmers to progress with their swimming skills to the point where they are proficient in all strokes. Our club membership in the development programme is fully subscribed; it is unfortunate that we do not have the pool space to accommodate our waiting list.

Despite the increase in charges that we have had to pass on, QSC have subsidised lane hire substantially. The Early Bird Swim Meet in October 2008 raised a record \$9,000 which enabled the subsidising of the lane hire for members.

Our Early Bird Meet has therefore become a vitally important and necessary fundraiser for our club going forward. We thank the generous support of our corporate and local sponsors. We have proved how well this concept works, so thank you in advance for your continued commitment to this now cornerstone club event – scheduled this year for 10 October.

The club has also enjoyed a very smart new uniform this season, thanks to the work of your committee, and we would like to acknowledge our generous uniform sponsors – Queenstown Collision Centre and Rilean Construction.

General

We invested \$6,375.00 in our Sports Science programme. We contributed \$3,940.00 to the User Pays component of our NZ Representative costs and covered all of the costs of coaches and managers attending National meets. Finally we refunded a total of \$26,800.00 to swimmers to assist them with their costs to attend National Meets.

We were instrumental in encouraging Swimming Otago to set up the assistance plan for NZ Representatives and were thrilled to contribute 0.50c per entry from our first Winter meet this year. We are hopeful that all clubs running meets in Otago will make a similar contribution so that this fund can grow to the extent that it will make meaningful contribution to our NZ reps.

This especially important as the “User Pays” component for Age and Youth teams has skyrocketed – World University Games - \$6,000.00 and Trans Tasman - \$3,600.00.

The web site continues to be the main method of communicating with our members along with the employment of a part time administrator Waves is well placed to continue its growth and success.
